The guiding force behind the Choral Festival is Artistic Director Dennis Keene. Through his concerts and recordings with the Voices of Ascension, his regular guest appearances as conductor and clinician, and

his work as Director of the Chorus America Summer Conducting Workshops, he has emerged as one of the leading names in choral music today. Known for the depth of his musicality and for his committed and inspiring performances, Maestro Keene has also gained a reputation as a dedicated, demanding, and inspiring teacher.

Soprano Beverly Myers is known equally well for her creative and eclectic approach to teaching as for her expressive and multi-faceted performing, drawing on knowledge of music, languages,

body-work, mind/body connection in technique, and study of a broad range of musical styles. She has been a soloist with the New York Philharmonic, Brooklyn Philharmonic, Voices of Ascension, and Musica Sacra; the opera companies of Philadelphia, Cleveland, and Boston; a touring artist for Columbia Artists' Community Concerts; and an ensemble singer for many premier professional choruses. Ms. Myers is also well known as a private voice teacher in New York City and she is a member of the Faculty of Adelphi University.

Tenor James Archie Worley has recently been added to the roster of the Metropolitan Opera. He enjoys a career that spans from perform-

ances of the Verdi *Requiem* in China to frequent oratorio engagements at Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall with such orchestras as the New York Philharmonic, the American Symphony Orchestra, Brooklyn Philharmonic, and the Orchestra of St. Luke's. He was the tenor soloist with Dennis Keene and the festival chorus and orchestra at last year's triumphant Caramoor debut. He is a regular member of the Voices of Ascension and has recorded extensively. Mr. Worley attended the University of Georgia and the Manhattan School of Music. He maintains a private voice studio in New York City.

In August, 1998 a major new choral festival was inaugurated: The Dennis Keene Choral Festival. Based at Kent School in Kent, Connecticut, and now in its fifth season, the Festival has become an internationally acclaimed choral training institute for ensemble singers and conductors.

The festival provides a unique opportunity for committed avocational choral singers to study, rehearse, and perform side-by-side with professional singers, and for both established conductors and serious students to learn from master conductors, all in pursuit of the highest levels of the choral art.

For 2002, the Festival will culminate in a complete, world-class performance of Mendelssohn's Elijah at the famed Caramoor Summer Music Festival in Katonah, New York.

About Kent School



Kent School is located on 1,533 beautiful acres bordering the Housatonic River, in the picturesque Litchfield Hills of northwest Connecticut, 55 miles west of Hartford and 78 miles north of New York City. The area abounds with the natural beauty of rural New England, offering many nearby opportunities for hiking, bicycling, picnics and shopping for antiques.

It is accessible by train, bus, car or airplane. There are many walking and biking trails on the school property and at nearby Macedonia Brook State Park. The accommodations at the Kent School are simple

dormitory rooms with shared bathrooms. Come in search of good times and simple pleasures, but don't expect luxury.

A short walk from the campus, the quaint village of Kent features an active arts community, including numerous galleries and the Kent Art Association. Bull's Bridge, one of two covered bridges in the region, spans the scenic Housatonic River, and can be reached by car or on foot by way of the Appalachian Trail. The nearby Sloane-Stanley Museum is built from the remains of artist and author Eric Sloane's studio. The Kent town center features fine restaurants and unique shops.

About The Caramoor Music Festival

Set on the beautiful grounds of the former estate of Walter and Lucie Rosen, the Caramoor Summer Music Festival features many of the world's preeminent classical performing artists. After our triumphant debut last season, we return to Caramoor for our final gala concert, which will take place on Sunday, August 4 at 4:00 p.m. in Caramoor's Venetian Theater as part of the 2002 International Music Festival.



Singers' Program Saturday, July 27 - Sunday, August 4

A nine-day experience dedicated to excellence of the choral art, where singers may follow the basic schedule and enjoy the countryside in their spare time, or opt for total musical immersion.

The goal of the Festival is maximum growth of each singer's skills as an ensemble singer. Through a great variety of opportunities — vocal classes, sectional coachings, ensemble classes, solo lessons and coachings, lectures, workshops, rehearsals and the final concert — each singer will find ample ways to stretch his/her ability.

REHEARSALS, LECTURES, AND GALA PERFORMANCE.

This year, the Dennis Keene Choral Festival will be dedicated to a complete, world-class performance of Mendelssohn's great epic masterpiece, *Elijah* (in English). All aspects of this special presentation will be under the personal direction of Dennis Keene. It will be an intensive nine days of rehearsals, classes and workshops, culminating in a gala performance at the world-famous Caramoor International Music Festival, one of the country's most presti-

gious summer music venues, located one hour from the Kent campus. (Our Caramoor debut last year was greeted with a capacity crowd and an extended standing ovation!) All singers will be required to know their parts thoroughly before arriving at Kent.

NEW AND EXPANDED ELECTIVE MUSICAL

ACTIVITIES. This season, in addition to the basic schedule of rehearsals and concert, Keenefest will offer a rich selection of

Conductors' Program Friday, July 26 - Sunday, August 4

A ten-day workshop dedicated to the highest professional levels of conducting, for established professional choral and orchestral conductors and for serious students.

For 2002, the two separate weeks of the conductors' program in past years will be combined into one ten-day program. In this year's rich program, conductors will receive extensive daily instruction and information on virtually every aspect of Mendelssohn's *Elijah* as they observe this great work being

prepared for performance. In addition, there will be lectures on the art of conducting and seven conducting master classes where selected participants will conduct excerpts from Elijah and receive specific, on-the-podium instruction from Maestro Keene. All conductors may attend all rehearsals and the performance, all conductor meetings, lectures, and all conducting master classes. Those conductors who wish to get up on the podium at master classes should apply as Conducting Fellows. Conductors may sing in the chorus if desired. This entire ten-day program will be led by Maestro Keene.

REHEARSALS AND GALA PERFORMANCE AT THE WORLD-FAMOUS CARAMOOR MUSIC FESTIVAL.

Conductors may sing in the Festival Chorus or observe.

CONDUCTOR MEETINGS WITH DENNIS KEENE. After most rehearsals Maestro Keene will discuss the problems and solutions of the rehearsal, choral techniques, conducting techniques, interpretations, and any topics the conductors wish to discuss.

CONDUCTOR LECTURES/CLASSES.

At the beginning of the week there will be classes on *Elijah* just for conductors, covering such topics as score study, editions, performance practice, interpretation choices, each movement's rehearsal and conducting

technique problems, the vocal and orchestral forces needed, the layout of forces, marking orchestral parts, bowings, and other topics.

CONDUCTING MASTER CLASSES.

Throughout the week, Maestro Keene will talk about the art of conducting and will give seven conducting master classes where selected participants will conduct excerpts from Elijah and receive specific, on-the-podium instruction.

REPERTORY. The entire week will be devoted to Mendelssohn's *Elijah* (complete, in English).

Conductors may choose to participate in either of two categories:

1) Conductors. Conductors may attend all rehearsals and the performance, all conduc-

tor meetings, lectures and classes, and all the conducting master classes. If so desired, they may opt to attend some vocal classes in lieu of some of the conducting classes. (The classes run simultaneously.) Conductors may sing in the chorus if desired.

2) Conducting Fellows. This year, 25 Conducting Fellows will be chosen from applicants to conduct in the seven master classes. Each Fellow will be given two times on the podium, including once with a chamber orchestra. All sessions will be videotaped. (Fellows may, of course, attend all events listed above under "Conductors.") They may sing in the chorus if desired.

Due to space limitations of the Caramoor stage, we must limit the total number of singing participants to 100. Conducting Fellows will be limited to 25. Qualified applicants will be chosen according to the date of their postmark, on-line application, or fax. All applicants will be notified of their status within a few days of receipt of their complete application.

A complete application must include: application form, vocal placement tape or Conducting Fellow audition tape (if applicable), résumé, and application fee (\$25). Former attendees of Keenefest need to send only the application form and fee.

Singers' Vocal Placement

All first-time singers at Keenefest must sing a few passages for us, for vocal placement. This is very brief and simple, and may be done **by tape** (include with your application package), **in person at various locations** (call 212-358-1469 for an appointment), or **on the telephone** (call 212-358-1469 for an appointment).

- 1) Please show us your vocal range by singing a scale from your middle register to your lowest notes, and then by singing from your middle register to your highest notes.
- **2)** Sing "My Country 'tis of thee" without any accompaniment.

Conductors

Conductors who wish to sing with the chorus should show in their résumés their ensemble singing experience.

Conducting Fellow Tapes

For those wishing to apply for the first time as Conducting Fellows please send with your application an audio cassette or videotape of you conducting. Please label the tapes clearly with your name. We are not able to return tapes. Other Conductors need not send tapes.
